#### **ALL:**

O Lord God, heavenly Father, we poor sinners confess that in our flesh dwells no good thing and that, left to ourselves, we die and perish in sin, since that which is born of the flesh is flesh and cannot see the kingdom of God. But we ask that you would give us your grace and mercy and for the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, send your Holy Spirit into our hearts, that being born again in him, we may firmly believe the forgiveness of sins according to your promise in baptism, and that we may daily increase in brotherly love and in other good works, until we at last obtain eternal salvation; through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one true God, now and forever.

Silent Confession of Sin

Leader: Cleanse out the old leaven that you may be a new lump, as you really are unleavened. For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed.

ALL: Let us therefore celebrate the festival, not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

Confession of Faith

The Belgic Confession, Article 25

ALL: We believe that the ceremonies and symbols of the law ceased at the coming of Christ, and that all the shadows are accomplished; so that the use of them must be abolished among Christians; yet the truth and substance of them remain with us in Jesus Christ, in whom they have their completion. In the meantime we still use the testimonies taken out of the law and the prophets to confirm us in the doctrine of the gospel, and to regulate our life in all honourableness to the glory of God, according to His will.
