ALL: Lord, the disease of pride remains fixed in us, passed down through our original corruption from our father Adam. So teach us to subdue our spirits and to not be pleased with the way we behave. Then, renewed by your Spirit, help us to walk in true humility and modesty, until you raise us up to your kingdom. Amen.

Silent Confession of Sin

Leader: In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him.

ALL: In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

Here Is Love (Everlasting Praise)

Q105: What is God's will for you in the sixth commandment?

A105: I am not to belittle, hate, insult, or kill my neighbor – not by my thoughts, my words, my look or gesture, and certainly not by actual deeds – and I am not to be party to this in others; rather, I am to put away all desire for revenge. I am not to harm or recklessly endanger myself either. Prevention of murder is also why government is armed with the sword.

Q106: Does this commandment refer only to murder?

A106: By forbidding murder God teaches us that he hates the root of murder: envy, hatred, anger, vindictiveness. In God's sight all such are disguised forms of murder.
