Silent Confession of Sin

Leader: Cleanse out the old leaven that you may be a new lump, as you really are unleavened. For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed.

ALL: Let us therefore celebrate the festival, not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

Confession of Faith

The Heidelberg Catechism, Q&A #75

- Leader: How does the Lord's supper signify and seal to you that you share in Christ's one sacrifice on the cross and in all his gifts?
- ALL: In this way: Christ has commanded me and all believers to eat of this broken bread and drink of this cup in remembrance of him. With this command he gave these promises: First, as surely as I see with my eyes the bread of the Lord broken for me and the cup given to me, so surely was his body offered for me on the cross. Second, as surely as I receive from the hand of the minister and taste with my mouth the bread and the cup of the Lord as sure signs of Christ's body and blood, so surely does he himself nourish and refresh my soul to everlasting life with his crucified body and shed blood.

Distribution of the Bread and Cup

Minister: When we eat this meal we are reminded that we are not our own,

Minister: The bread that we break is a sharing in the body of Christ.

ALL: And we who are many are one in Him! (partake of the bread together)

Minister: The cup that we drink is a sharing in the blood of Christ.

ALL: And we who are many are one in Him! (partake of the cup together)
